<sup>\*</sup>The bicycle part should preferably be performed by a percussionist. The bicycle must have three old-fashioned bike horns of different pitches and a modern-style bike bell (one that has a single "ping" and not the old-fashioned double "tring-tring") attached to the handlebars. For playing the bicycle part a pair of drum sticks and a contrabass bow are needed.
